#### **May 28 Joint Finance Committee**



On Tuesday May 28 the Legislature's Joint Committee on Finance took up parts of the budget related to Environmental Quality for the Dept of Natural Resources and Dept of Agriculture Trade and Consumer Protection. The Committee passed an Omnibus Motion which falls short of the state investment we recommend in Opportunities Now 2019-2021, which we shared with all legislators in March. However, our work, along with that of many other partners, has helped inform the discussion about water issues in Wisconsin. The Committee

meeting was also broadcast on Wisconsin Eye <a href="https://wiseye.org/2019/05/28/joint-committee-on-finance-105/">https://wiseye.org/2019/05/28/joint-committee-on-finance-105/</a>. The Committee will take up budget items related to Fisheries, Wildlife, Parks, Stewardship Fund, and Forestry in a subsequent session which may be as soon as Tuesday June 4.
